Potentate's Message

The joy of 75+ when your emotional intelligence is peaking. Research suggests that adults in their 70's are more sensitive to the pain and suffering of others, tend to be better at seeing the upside of stressful or negative situations-which helps manage their feelings without shutting down or burning bridges.

Life is a lake of memories to swim in. Love is taking it all in, planning and hoping for the best. Admiring the lake's shimmering surface and unknown depths. Building a bank of memories and cherishing them all equally.

Most of us believe that leadership is the key to success. But I say there is a lot to be said for taking a backseat. My job as a teacher, as well as Potentate, can be happy or I can be terrified. At this international business management school the 100-plus students had much more money and experience in real-world business. My subject was ethics in today's business world, I decided to follow them. I found a shoe box, cut a slit in the top and wrote "Feedback and recommendations" on the side. Then I took the box to class

"Your tuition pays my salary", I told my students, "I work for you, as your subordinate, I'll do the best I can, but as my leaders, you can help me do better." (As Potentate of Almas Shrine I have worked for the members.)

I asked the students to write down feedback and slip their comments in to the box anonymously. All I asked was that with every negative comment they also included a suggestion about how I can improve.


My colleagues were horrified by this approach. "You'll lose control of the classroom" one of them said. "They'll destroy you!" I handled his advice just as I did my feedback by presenting it to my students and asking what they thought. The students pointed out that for a teacher, as for a manager or any other kind of leader, Potentate, suppressing negative feedback alienates people and prohibits communication of the very information necessary to improve. We had a memorable discussion and class about the benefits to be found. The class gave me an award and an engraved watch "Following is good."

"All streams flow to the sea because it lies below them." wrote the Chinese philosopher Lao Tzu. If you want to lead people, he goes on to say, you must be willing to follow them. I state "enjoy the privilege and fellowship of leadership. Being willing to follow, as well as to lead, is how we maximize our collective strengths."

When Tzu referred to those streams he was describing the flow of energy that creates balance and harmony, including our own feelings of inner tranquillity. Doing whatever brings us the most inner peace is how we align ourselves with the benevolent power.

I thought the power of harmony was metaphorical until I studied a Japanese martial art called Aikido, or "The way of the harmonious spirit." An Aikido master's object is not to crush opponents but to stay aligned with inner calm. Listen with your whole body. To follow means to focus attention on something until you understand it well. Declare your observations and ask for disconfirmation (ask to be told where you're wrong) confident enough to handle negative feedback, humble to be corrected. Receive it calmly, even gratefully.



Election Regulations

Bylaws of Imperial Council 1.11 Election Regulations

- (a) Electioneering. A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume consisting of his educational background, his vocational history and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices by a unit, club, Noble or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.
- (b) Expenditures Prohibited. The expenditure of money for gifts, favors or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.
- (b.) Violation. For any violation of (a) or (b) the Imperial Potentate may suspend the offending Noble and he may declare the election of officers void and order a new election.
- (c.) Notice. At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

2014 White House Holiday Ornament Project



The 2DM Write House Christmas arrament honors the administration of Warren S. Harding, who served as the twenty-ninth president of the United States from 1921 to 1923. As a young boy, Harding dreamed of being a locomotive engineer—a wish that was to come true for SI minutes when as president, he took over the controls on the Alaskan relived during the "Voyage of Understanding," his famous transcentinental speaking and sightseeing tour. The Presidential Special, the train that convied President Harding wast at the outset of his ambitious voyage and that would bragically corry his casket back east following his sudden death, just two menths later, is the inspiration for our 2014 present.

Decarated with gold tones and enamel finishes, the 33rd annual White House Christines Dimensent is our first organization or property of two pieces, which can be hung as two expenses or linked together. The locametrie is a detailed ministure replica of one of several steam-powered locametries that pulled the Presidential Special, it is attached to the coal car that held its fact. The other ministure can is the Superb, the president's private heavy-weight Pullman can. The last can on the Special, the Superb was outlitted with a public address system. President Harding made appearances and delivered speeches at stops series the caustry from a platform at the back of the car. The last known photograph of President Harding is an image of him on the Superb shortly before his death in a San Francisco hotel on August 2, 1923. On August 3, President Harding's coalest was placed an board the Superb and began a return trip to Washington, 0.C., during which an estimated 3 million people poid their last respects.
