

Shriners in 1919 notifying them of the upcoming June 3rd ceremonial. The Ceremonial was to be held at the Liberty Hut; a large meeting venue located near Union Station on First Street, NE. A target number of 500 candidates was set for the Ceremonial.

Almas Nobles were given specific instructions to enter by 7:30 PM via Door No. 4 located on First Street. Unfortunately, little information can be found about the Liberty Hut other than the location and a few sepia toned

images. Nobles were reminded that a 1919 Red and White dues card was required for admittance.

An invitation was extended to visiting Nobles provided they "can show the correct Passport (Red and White card) to the Outer Guards and

can speak the language of our Tribe-Selah!"

Candidates were instructed to report to Door No. 2 by 6:30. An interesting side note in the instructions reads "full dress (collar and tie) is not required but must take a bath and wear clean underwear."



The last two pages cover preparations of Almas nobility to attend the 1919 Imperial Session in Indianapolis. A special train was to depart Saturday, June 7th at 8:00 PM for Pittsburg to arrive at 5:15 the



next morning. Nobles then were to board a train departing at 5:30 to arrive in Indianapolis at 2:40. The Almas Patrol—a marching unit—and two bands where slated to attend the session. At that time, Almas had two active bands: the fully equipped Almas Band, and the Oriental Band.

Parades

Parades are one of ways that we promote The Shrine and the work we do in support of the World's greatest philanthropy—Shriners Children's—one of the largest pediatric healthcare systems worldwide. Shriners are recognized for wearing the funny red hat and driving little cars in parades. Almas regularly participates in three DC parades; Chinese Lunar New Year, Cherry Blossom Parade, and the National

Independence Day Parade.

Shriners International recognizes and regulates Shrine Center participation in two categories of parades. The ones mentioned above are civic parades. Family members and non-Shriners can participate but cannot operate vehicles. The second category is Shrine Parades. These are parades organized by Shrine organizations at Imperial or Regional meetings. Only Shriners can participate in these parades



and must be identified as Shriners by wearing a Fez and/or a unit or club uniform.



Almas Mini-Motors operates go-karts at parades and in competitions at Shrine meetings. During parades they demonstrate some of the drills they do at competitions. There are a limited number of minivehicles—Tin Lizzies—and scooters available to operate

or ride during parades. Special provisions and training is provided by the Colonel's staff and is required. For civic parades, family members ride in the Almas fire engine or other provided vehicles.





Parades do not happen in a vacuum. A great deal of pre-parade work is done in preparation. Everything from administrative filling out forms to preparing units and vehicles. Support this work by committing to and helping pre-parade preparation through work days at the warehouse. On parade day help with unloading and set up of parade units. Post

parade help with disassembly and preparing parade units for transport.

The Shrine is about having fun while promoting our hospitals. Parades are a big part of the that fun. Contact the Colonel or the Units or his staff to join us and find out.

FAMOUS FEZ

Illustrious Brother Ernest Borgnine

Seldom in modern entertainment is there an actor or actress who transcends the age boundary and is universally known by all generations. One of these rare performers was Ernest Borgnine, who was not only one of the most prolific actors of the past 100 years but was also a 33° Brother from Virginia.

Brother Borgnine was born to Anna Boselli and Camillo Borgnino, on January 24, 1917 in Hamden, Connecticut. In his younger years Bro. Borgnine was an active and athletic young man. He took an interest in any physical activity, but had a particular affinity for boxing and theater. He attended James Hillhouse High School in New Haven, Connecticut, and graduated in 1935.



Almost immediately after graduating, Bro. Borgnine enlisted in the U.S. Navy, where he served aboard the Minesweeper *USS Lamberton*, from 1935-1941. He re-enlisted in 1942 after the attack on Pearl Harbor, and served aboard the *USS Sylph* until 1945 when he was Honorably Discharged.

After returning home from the Navy, Bro. Borgnine decided to enroll at the Randall School for Dramatic Arts, and studied there for six months. After this time he moved to Abingdon, Virginia, where he became a member of the Barter Theater. He served the theater in many capacities, starting as a set designer and moving all the way up to a leading man. During his time at the Barter Theater, Bro. Borgnine joined Abingdon Lodge No. 48. Borgnine took his Entered Apprentice degree on July 7, 1948. Several months later on April 25, 1949, he was passed to the degree of Fellowcraft and after another week he was raised a Master Mason on May 2, 1949.

In 1951, he made the decision to move to California and work as a full time actor. Working through several bit roles, he got his big break as Army Sergeant "Fatso" Judson in From Here to Eternity. After this role he began getting more work and won his first Oscar in 1955 for his leading role in Marty. He continued working assorted Hollywood roles until 1962 when he was cast in his most well known role as Quinton McHale on the T.V. show McHale's Navy. Later on in life Bro. Borgnine starred in another famous T.V. role. In 1999 he became the voice of "Mermaid Man" on the children's show Spongebob, a role that some of our younger members may be familiar with. The stability of T.V. allowed Bro. Borgnine to become more active in masonic work. He completed his Scottish Rite degrees in the Valley of Los Angeles on March 14, 1964. On June 6 of the same year he became a Noble at Al Malaikah Shrine Temple. The next year on February 4, 1965, Borgnine became a dual member at Hollywood Lodge No. 355. In 1979, Bro. Borgnine received the Knight Commander of the Court of Honor (K.C.C.H.), the 33° was conferred upon him in 1983, and in 1991 he was awarded the Grand Cross.

Not content to just be a "celebrity mason" Bro. Borgnine used his starpower to help promote the good work the craft does. He became an active member of the Scottish Rite Childhood Language Center, and between 1972 and 2002 he marched several times in a Shrine unit as the "Grand Clown" in the Great Circus Parade in Milwaukee. Outside of masonic work Bro. Borgnine worked on behalf of Veterans with the National Salute to Hospitalized veterans, which he was the Chairman of in 1996.

Brother Borgnine lived a long and fulfilling life, worthy of admiration. He passed away on July 8, 2012, from complications associated with kidney failure. If you would like to know more about our Illustrious Brother, click here!



Ceremonial Cast

The Ceremonial Cast is responsible for presenting the initiation for new nobles. There is more than one degree in the initiation which includes not only the ceremony in which you participated, but also an Arch Degree which encompasses a presentation of all the Masonic Bodies collectively. The Arch Degree requires more than 50 nobles to present and is intended to be more for the families of new nobles than for the nobles themselves. To my knowledge, Almas Shrine has never presented the Arch Degree, but it is something to which we aspire.

The primary ceremonial is the ritualistic initation and can be presented either open or closed at the discretion of the Potentate.

Being a part of the Ceremonial Cast includes some memorization, but it is also intended to be the 'fun' ritual where we can dress in costumes and have a good time while presenting good ritual. It would be nice to be a ritualist but that is not required as there are non-speaking parts as well as behind the scenes activities that go into the Ceremonial.

Generally, we have three rehearsals to prepare for each Ceremonial, but can also participate in parades in costume as well. The Ceremonials are held two times a year.

Almas Yacht Club

The Almas Yacht Club was formed to provide an organization for those Shriners interested in sailing on the waters surrounding the Chesapeake Bay.

The conception of the Almas Yacht Club was the result of a group of Almas Shriners interested in forming such a club in 1955. The yacht club, consisting of 23 members, became an entity in 1956 when it received its charter. The first Bridge consisted of the following: Commodore – Alton S. Bradford, Vice Commodore – Edward C. Baltz, Rear Commodore – Robert Doing, Fleet Captain – Garrett Beitzell, Secretary – Jack J. Blank, Treasurer – Roy Lyman Sexton.

Membership in the Yacht Club has fluctuated over the years. From its meager beginning of 23 members, it grew to 86 by 1967 and had a fleet of 54 boats ranging in size from 12 feet to 67 feet in length. Records are a bit sketchy from the early years, but by 1982, membership had decreased to 70 members with 27 boats. In 1991 there were 57 members and 22 boats; 1999 had 37 members and 13 boats; in 2012 there were 43 members and 7 boats.

The decreasing boat numbers dictated that we had to change the focus of the club from one of boating activities to include land functions as well where we would meet at a variety of restaurants or similar locations to conduct meetings and take care of the business of the club. We still maintained our membership in the Mid-Atlantic Association of Shrine Yacht Clubs (MAASYC) where we would meet at a selected location for the annual summer rendezvous. Many members of the other yacht clubs in MAASYC would bring their boats and engage in a friendly competition of a boat parade, boat decoration and other fun activities. We also participated in the activities of the annual Mid-Atlantic Shrine Association (MASA) where the several Shrine Temples engaged in a variety of club competitions which would culminate in the annual parade.

The ultimate goal of the numerous activities of the temple yacht clubs was to win the *Evers Trophy*, a large trophy awarded to the yacht club which amassed the most points over a twelve-month period beginning with the MASA convention parade were the Shrine Centers compete with their floats and marching units. The name "Almas" appears on this trophy several times.

From the outset, it should be noted that our Ladies have always been an intricate part of the Yacht Club. Over the years they have provided delicious meals and refreshments at many of our functions and assisted in many of our activities. We will always be grateful for their willingness to be an active part of the club.

Although it has been necessary to change some of our boating activities, we have never compromised our enthusiasm, zeal or any of our Shrine principles to enjoy good fellowship, welcome new Nobles and their Ladies into our club, provide support to the members when needed, and support the Shriners Hospitals for Children.

The Yacht Club extends an invitation to all Shriners to investigate and join in our activities and consider becoming a member. Ownership of a boat is not necessary.

The conception of the Almas Yacht Club was the result of a group of Almas Shriners interested in forming such a club in 1955. The yacht club, consisting of 23 members, became an entity in 1956 when it received its charter. The first Bridge consisted of the following: Commodore – Alton S. Bradford, Vice Commodore – Edward C. Baltz, Rear Commodore – Robert Doing, Fleet Captain – Garrett Beitzell, Secretary – Jack J. Blank, Treasurer – Roy Lyman Sexton.

Membership in the Yacht Club has fluctuated over the years. From its meager beginning of 23 members, it grew to 86 by 1967 and had a fleet of 54 boats ranging in size from 12 feet to 67 feet in length. Records are a bit sketchy from the early years, but by 1982, membership had decreased to 70 members with 27 boats. In 1991 there were 57 members and 22 boats; 1999 had 37 members and 13 boats; in 2012 there were 43 members and 7 boats.

The decreasing boat numbers dictated that we had to change the focus of the club from one of boating activities to include land functions as well where we would meet at a variety of restaurants or similar locations to conduct meetings and take care of the business of the club. We still maintained our membership in the Mid-Atlantic Association of Shrine Yacht Clubs (MAASYC) where we would meet at a selected location for the annual summer rendezvous. Many members of the other yacht clubs in MAASYC would bring their boats and engage in a friendly competition of a boat parade, boat decoration and other fun activities. We also participated in the activities of the annual Mid-Atlantic Shrine Association (MASA) where the several Shrine Temples engaged in a variety of club competitions which would culminate in the annual parade.

The ultimate goal of the numerous activities of the temple yacht clubs was to win the Evers Trophy, a large trophy awarded to the yacht club which amassed the most points over a twelve-month period beginning with the MASA convention parade were the Shrine Centers compete with their floats and marching units. The name "Almas" appears on this trophy several times.





FEZ FOODIES

CLASSIC MENUDO

INGREDIENTS

- 1 lemon or 6 big calamansi (optional)
- 1 pound pork cut into bite-size cubes
- ½ pound liver (pork) cut into bite-size cubes
- 4 pieces hotdogs/sausages cut into small diagonal slices
- 3 tablespoons oil
- 2 cloves garlic minced
- 1 medium onion chopped
- 1 cup tomato sauce
- 2 cups water
- 2 medium potatoes cut into cubes
- 2 medium carrots cut into cube
- 1½ 2 teaspoons salt
- ¼ teaspoon ground pepper
- 1 small red bell pepper cut into squares
- 1 cup green peas (optional) (canned)



IRECTIONS

- 1. If you want, marinate both the pork meat and liver with calamansi or lemon juice for at least 10 minutes.
- 2. In a deep skillet, saute garlic and onion in oil over medium heat until limp and translucent.
- 3. Add the pork and cook, stirring constantly, until all sides are no longer pink. Pour the tomato sauce and 1 cup water and let it simmer for 15-20 minutes, covered.
- 4. Add the liver and cook for some seconds while constantly stirring until sides are done.
- 5. Then add the hotdogs, carrots, potatoes and bell pepper. Add another cup of water and season with salt and pepper. Cover and let it simmer, stirring from time to time, for 15-20 minutes or until vegetables are cooked. Stir in the green peas and cook for another minute.
- 6. Serve with rice or bread.

Like all tomato-based stews, Menudo is best eaten the following day to give it some time for the flavors to blend. If you've got the time, cook the pork meat longer over low heat to make sure the meat is really tender. If in a hurry, use a more tender cut like the loin. Pork belly may be added.
