The Grand Lodge of the District of Columbia will be hosting International Brotherhood Week at that same time. Rather than hold a special dinner for the guests in town for that event, the Grand Lodge will be recommending to the out of town guests and to the constituent lodges that they buy tables at our Gala. This will also serve to inform those Masonic brethren who are not Shriners of the good work that the Shrine does and to show that Almas is taking center stage for Shrinedom in DC for 2011.

I am presently writing this article from my hotel room in Tampa, FL where Assistant Rabban Ricardo Rodriguez and myself, along with my Lady Iris are attending the Assistant Rabban's Seminar. 

# Jonathan gets his wheels!



A couple of months ago I received a phone call from a lady named Heather. She is the mother of a little 3 1/2 year old boy named Jonathan. She informed me that her son was born with autism and severe hypotonia. He has very weak muscles. He has been going to therapy in Springfield Virginia once or twice a week for about an hour each time. There he uses a tricycle, which is designed for children to strengthen all of their muscles in their legs and arms at the same time. Jonathan's therapist suggested that the family purchase one of these special tricycles so that the family could help Jonathan get more therapy at home. The family could not afford the cost of the tricycle and their insurance felt that it was not justified. A friend of the family suggested that she contact the Shriners because, "They help children all the time." That is what led to Heather's phone call.

I informed Heather that Shriners Hospitals did not handle the type of condition that Jonathan has but that I would do some investigation into the cost of the tricycle and then I would present it to our members to see if any of them would want to help. I found out that the cost of the tricycle would be \$409. Therefore, I put out an e-mail appeal to the Heads of the Units and Clubs plus the Divan members. Well, the pledges began to roll in and before I knew it, I had \$500 in pledges. Therefore, I e-mailed everyone back to inform them that I had enough pledges to cover the purchase.

I called Heather back to inform her that we would purchase the tricycle and she was elated. In fact that same day her husband, Joel, was returning home from the military and that, the family was twice blessed that day.

I placed the order for the tricycle as soon as I got off the phone with Heather and the young lady at the manufacturer of the tricycle, who had quoted me the cost of \$409 originally, when she found out that we where the Shriners she gave us a discount which brought the cost , including the shipping , to about \$336. A few days later, the tricycle came in and I assembled it so that Jonathan could use it as soon as he got it.

On Thursday, February 25th, Joel and Heather brought Jonathan and his big brother Samuel (and his friend Mr. Hippo) to the Shrine Center to pick-up Jonathan's new wheels. After a few adjustments Jonathan was strapped in and ready to go. Please see his smiling face in the pictures.

My personal thanks go out to the Provost Guard, the Northwest Shrine Club, the Latin Club and our newest club the Peruvian Shrine Club for their most generous contributions to the special need. I sent and e-mail out to these Units and Clubs and informed them that since we collected more money than we needed, for the tricycle, that if it was alright with them, I would make contributions in their names to the Almas Transportation Fund. I did not have one of them request a refund, so both Jonathan and the Transportation Fund benefitted from their generosity.

Thanks, also goes out to our Potentate, Ill. Sir Paul Friedlander and Past Potentates Ill. Sir Tony Murray and Ill. Sir Donald Ferguson who took time out of their busy schedules to be with me when Jonathan and his family came to the Shrine Center.




#### The Membership committee needs a few good men!!!


