We have created convenient pocket-sized fact cards with information and recommendations for keeping children safe. In addition to these cards, we also have several materials available concerning spinal cord injury prevention.

Please visit our secure online ordering site, review these pieces, and consider distributing them in your communities. Working together, we can help ensure the safety of children.

Some Health and Safety Facts:

Backpack Safety

When a child's backpack does not fit properly, it can injure muscles or joints and lead to other medical issues.

An appropriate backpack is one that is:

- · No wider than the user's chest
- · Worn no higher than the base of the neck
- Worn no lower than 2 to 4 inches below the waist
- Supported by a waist or chest strap
- Made of lightweight material

Vitamin D Deficiency

Severe vitamin D deficiency is becoming more prevalent, causing devastating health problems, including improper bone growth.

To maintain a healthy level of vitamin D, consider:

- Increasing foods such as milk, orange juice and salmon into a child's diet.
- Finding a healthy balance between sun intake and sunscreen application.
- Including vitamin D, either in gummy or liquid form, in a child's daily vitamin intake (when age appropriate).

Lawn Mower Safety

In 2010, approximately 253,000 people were treated for lawn mower-related injuries, nearly 17,000 of them children. By taking precautionary measures, serious and sometimes deadly injuries can be prevented.

To ensure lawn mower safety:

- Children under 6 years of age should be kept indoors during mowing.
- Never allow children to play with the mower, even when turned off.
- Do use mower on wet grass as it may cause your feet to lose traction and slide.


