Total assets are \$122,110.10





2014 White House Holiday Ornament Project



The 20M White House Christmas arrament hanges the administration of Warren S. Harding, who served as the twenty-ninth president of the United States from 1921 to 1923. As a young boy, Harding dreamed of being a locomotive engineer—a wish first was to come true for SI minutes when as president, he took over the controls on the Alaskan rullroad during the "Voyage of Understanding," his famous transcentinental speaking and sightseeing tour. The Presidential Special, the trein that cervied President Harding wast at the outset of his ambitious voyage and that would trapically carry his casket back east following his sudden death, just two months later, is the inspiration for our 2014 present.

Decarated with gold tones and pramed finishes, the 33rd annual White House Christmas Brownest is our first ornament to be comprised of two pieces, which can be hung as two separate prospectors or linked together. The locametrie is a detailed ministure replica of one of several steam-powered locametries that pulled the Presidential Special, it is attached to the coal care that held its fael. The other ministure can is the Superb, the president's private heavyweight Pullman can. The last can on the Special, the Superb was public address system. President Harding made appearances and delivered speeches at stops series the country from a plotform at the back of the can. The last known photograph of President Harding is an image of him on the Superb shortly before his death in a San Francisco hotel on August 2, 1923. Bin August 3, President Harding's peaket was placed on board the Superb and began a return trip to Washington, D.C., during which an estimated 3 million people poid their last respects.
