#### Ceremonial






All were given an opportunity to go thought the hospital and see firsthand the quality of the patients' rooms, the modern equipment and overall technical level of the AACD installations that are available to the children and



adults who are lucky enough to be patients. All were able to see modern robotic monitoring apparatuses, motion filming studios, fully equipped therapeutic recovery rooms and swimming pools

that serve the individual needs of the children, teens and adults recovering from or living with chronic birth defects and the individual traumas that



affect each of them. It's heartening to know that a few of the hospital's professional team have, in the past, received training in our Shriners Hospitals for Children system and it shows.

The hospital also provides a complete food service, an up-to-date surgical center, ICU aisle and has a 110 bed capacity which is divided into single, double or triple bed units and, of course, 'Toy Rooms' for kids of all ages.



Don and the other nobles were all very pleasantly surprised with everything they saw. Don went

on to say the, "This is a Shriners level hospital. They've got everything that our Philadelphia Hospital has and maybe a little more. I'm impressed."


A safe and happy holiday to all the Ladies and Nobles of Almas Temple.



#### Sao Paulo, Brazil Trip

The Shrine Clubs in Espitito Santo and in Sao Paulo both had meetings in November and as ambassador to the Sao Paulo Club, I was dispatched by Almas to visit for those meetings. On November 19th I left for Sao Paulo and arrived quite exhausted after more than 13 hours on two flights.

David Whitmore of the Sao Paulo club met me on my arrival Thursday and we then took a shorter flight to Espirito Santo and met with about 12 members, including the club President, Dr. Eduardo Antonio Beracchi Uvo, the club Treasurer DGM Walter Alves Noronha and the club translator Thiago Scalfoni. They took David and I to the Grand Lodge and we toured the building. The treasurer showed me their books bound by year and containing receipts for all actions and member dues payments to Almas. I was impressed with the organization of their records. After this, we went out for a dinner meeting and socializing. The past President complimented Tony Murray on his help with their By-Laws, and remembered seeing Tony and Jennifer in his travels.

David and I spent the night in Espirito Santo. On Friday, some of the club officers and members took us to visit Infantil E Maternidade/Dr. Alvir Bernadino Alves' hospital which treats infants and mothers. It was sparse and less well equipped than our hospitals however they are very proud of the hospital efforts and their club wishes to participate in helping the hospital.

David and I returned to Sao Paulo Friday on a very cramped flight. He and his wife Helena very generously hosted me in their home. On Saturday, David and I attended an open club ceremonial where they took in two new members. The cast, the new members and a few other visitors attended, including a young doctor, Luiz Ricardo de Andrade, who is seeking training in the United States, preferably at a Shriners Hospital. I have passed his resume on to Don Ferguson. The club President, Jose Henrique "Ica" Caldas Vianna, officiated. The club ritualist and future secretary, Henrique Alezandre de Barros, acted as Chief Rabban. I opened Almas Temple; the members voted on the petitions which were both approved and the new nobles went through the ceremonial. I thought the ceremonial was well done and Dr. Ricardo de Andrade will likely become a Shriner.

After this event, David and I went to a heavy lunch and toured some of Sao Paulo, went into the nearby mountains and returned to his house. The next day, Sunday, the club had arranged a visit to a rehab hospital, AACD or Associacao de Assistance a Criancas Deficiente, which I found very modern and well equipped. Pictures of the rooms and equipment were sent by Davis to the Almas office and some may appear in this alibi.

I conveyed to both clubs that they could put articles about their monthly activities (in both English and Portuguese) into the alibi, due prior to the 5th of the month. We look forward to seeing these reports and hope other Almas clubs will follow their lead.

Overall, I believe the trip was very successful and I believe the clubs will continue to grow under the guidance of their officers. I should note the length of trips and the extreme confinement of the seating made the trip very uncomfortable and difficult to rest and I strongly recommend a more comfortable seating class for such a long trip.
