



The following is a small excerpt that was published in Knight Templar Magazine, February 1996, by Sir Knight Wayne T. Adams. The highlights are mine.

"If we want our newly Raised candidates to take an active part in Lodge life, we need at least to give them an introduction to Masonry. Ritual alone, no matter how well done, is not going to make a knowledgeable Mason or an active Lodge member. If we want a man who believes in Masonry, a man who is an active Lodge member, we have to take the time to show, to teach, to guide that new Mason to a clearer understanding of the tenets of his profession as a Mason. In short, we cannot just Raise a candidate and then drop him.

We have to start by making sure that we, ourselves, <u>have a positive attitude.</u> Masonry has much to offer. It has been a source of wisdom and personal satisfaction to millions of good men. Its principles and its benefits are as valuable and as timely today as they ever have been. Still, this question confronts us: <u>Why are not more young men today interested in joining and participating in our Fraternity?</u> I believe the answer, in large part, is that we fail to present Masonry in ways that appeal to a younger generation of men. The men we want are activity oriented. We want the men who would rather to Do something than Be something."

While written twenty years ago these words hold true for today's Masons and today's Shriners. Almas has initiated many new nobles over the last year and we must be sure to welcome them with open arms to our Fraternity. Several of these new nobles are already working hard to make a mark on Almas by bringing in new members, sponsoring events, and engaging in our clubs and units. That said, if we want our nobility to flourish we must, as Sir Adams stated, ensure that once we make a noble we don't just drop them.

It's incumbent upon our more seasoned nobles to pass down the knowledge of our organization. While never intended to be a secret, much of the knowledge of Almas lives, like Ritual, in the minds of our members. We must recall that we were once new and admonish ourselves that these new nobles do not know what we know. They have likely never run a club but offer to do so with great enthusiasm. They have



never organized a parade but are willing to find their way with or without us.

They have never sponsored one of our annual events even though they do so with great pride. Our new nobles are finding their way but <u>they are doing so</u> the hard way. Please take some time to meet our new members, share with them your stories of fun and fellowship and while you are together pass on a few of those Almas secrets and help make us a stronger temple.



Carli celebrates a birthday by giving back


