

Selby family makes incredible gift to Boston Shriners Hospital to mark 50th anniversary

Wednesday, November 28, 2018

Becci Selby Sutphin and Stephanie Selby Biffle vividly remember the moment when they learned that their cousins had been horrifically injured in an accident. It was 1983, and Jamie and Glen Selby, ages 5 and 7, were severely burned over 95 percent of their bodies. They were given little chance of survival. When local doctors learned of new experimental procedures in burn care at the Shriners Burns Institute (now Shriners Hospitals for Children — Boston), the boys were airlifted to Boston.

Howard Green, M.D., a Harvard researcher, had discovered a method of regenerating a person's own skin cells. Dr. Green teamed up with doctors at the Boston Shriners Hospital to save the Selby brothers' lives. By taking a patch of skin the size of a postage stamp from each of the boys, his team was able to grow new skin in large sheets called grafts. The boys underwent numerous procedures to place hundreds of grafts on their wounds, and were known to be the first to survive such extensive burns.



Becci and Stephanie's parents, Frank and Terry Selby, remained very close to Jamie and Glen when they returned home to Wyoming. Terry, a registered nurse, would help with the boys' care when they visited. Hometown residents of Casper, Wyoming rallied around the boys and rejoiced in their homecoming. Becci remembers that the staff from the Boston Shriners Hospital sent a videotape with information on what the boys had been through and what support they would need. It was a start, but she recalls that no one was truly prepared for the full extent of their injuries.

The Selby family has forever been grateful to Dr. Green and the Boston Shriners Hospital staff for saving the boys' lives, and their connection to the hospital's mission runs deep. Following his nephews' hospital stay, Frank Selby became a Mason, the first step to becoming a Shriner. He has been a member of Korein Temple Shriners since 1992, and later embarked on the ten-year journey to become Potentate (the Temple's leader) with his wife Terry by his side. Together they envisioned Frank's year as Potentate as one of fundraising for the Boston Shriners Hospital, with a special visit to Boston that happened to coincide with the hospital's 50th anniversary. Sadly, Terry passed away suddenly four years ago, but the family was determined to carry on in her name.

Becci is an active member of the Ladies of the Oriental Shrine of North America and is currently a High Priestess of Kheta Court #59 in Wyoming. Her husband, Jesse, is a High Priest and Prophet in the Korein Divan. Stephanie has actively supported her family's efforts throughout the years. Terry's dear friend Linda Kostenbauer also stepped in to help fulfill Terry's work. Over the past year, the family has raised money by organizing gift basket raffles at every Shrine club meeting, temple event, and even at the Pacific Northwest Shrine Association Conference. They also organized silent auctions and a Potentate Banquet.

When Becci learned that school and community reintegration programs have evolved tremendously in the past 35 years, she knew exactly how their donation could help. At the Boston Shriners Hospital, staff members create individual transition plans and educational materials when patients return to their communities, and often travel to schools to educate teachers and students. The program is a vital resource that helps kids transition back to the classroom after a burn, or other traumatic illness or injury.

Earlier this month, Shriners Hospitals for Children — Boston celebrated its 50th anniversary. The Selbys were there to mark the occasion and celebrate along with patients and families, staff, board members and friends of the hospital. They had an opportunity to speak with many of the people who cared for their family members and thank them. In front of a captive audience of 200 guests, Becci shared her cousins' moving story and proudly presented Mr. Robert Baker, chairman of the board of governors, with a donation of over \$26,000 for the hospital's school re-entry program.

"There's a heart behind every dollar and I am very proud of that," Becci noted. As Frank reflected on the hospital's 50th anniversary theme, "Proud of Our Past, Focused on our Future," he said that he has been able to see the whole journey from the past to the future. He is eternally grateful to staff members for saving his nephews, for the ongoing commitment of caring for kids with serious burns and for the opportunity to help support the hospital into the future.

Teamwork: Together Everyone Achieves More

Scott Kozin, M.D., chief of staff of Shriners Hospitals for Children® — Philadelphia, loves to tell the story of two, four, six, eight.

At 2 years old, Zion developed a serious infection that required his hands and feet to be amputated. At 4 years old, he received a kidney transplant; the donor was his mother, Pattie. Zion was taking anti-rejection drugs to keep his new kidney functioning. At age 6, Zion came to Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia for new prosthetic legs.

The evaluation of Zion's lower extremities prior to his receiving those first prosthetics from Shriners Hospitals was the impetus that led to his hand transplantation. The idea to give Zion hands was possible because he met the prerequisite of already being a transplant recipient and successfully taking immunosuppressant medications.



At 8 years old, Zion received the first bilateral pediatric hand transplantation at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia along with help from Penn Medicine, Gift of Life and hand surgeons from our Philadelphia hospital, Dr. Kozin and Dan Zlotolow, M.D. During the 11-hour procedure, four teams of physicians worked to transplant the hands from the donor to Zion. The procedure required boney fixation, artery and venous anastomosis along with nerve and tendon reconstruction. The surgery was successful.

"The collaboration between these institutions was necessary to assemble the team and organize the players to orchestrate such a complex and demanding procedure that had never been performed on a child," said Dr. Kozin.

Becoming Independent

Zion is now three years post-hand transplant surgery. Now 11 years old, he is a happy pre-teen and learning to be independent. He enjoys cooking and sports. "Zion is so comfortable living his normal life," said Pattie. "He enjoys playing laser tag with his friends, boxing, and is attending robotics camp this summer."

Zion continues to have occupational and physical therapy in his hometown. His mom couldn't be more happy with his progress. As Zion continues to grow and get taller, Pattie will bring him back to the Philadelphia Shriners Hospitals for Children



to be fitted for a new set of prosthetic legs. In the meantime, she is delighted that Zion is becoming more independent every day at home, at play, and at school.



He also completed a fellowship in hand and microvascular surgery at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota.

Dan A. Zlotolow, M.D., is a board certified orthopaedic hand surgeon for Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia. He received an undergraduate degree with honors in biology from Haverford College and earned a medical degree from the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine with early induction into the Alpha Omega Alpha Medical Honor Society. Dr. Zlotolow completed his residency in orthopaedics at the Montefiore Medical Center in New York and hand fellowship at the Roosevelt Hospital in New York and the Texas Scottish Rite Hospital for Children in Dallas.
