
Constitution Day



Constitution Day, also known as Constitution and Citizenship Day, honors the document which guarantees us as Americans our essential rights. Since its ratification on September 17, 1787, the Constitution of the United States has served as the basis for all our laws.

Our Founding Fathers framed the Constitution carefully, distributing power between three branches of government. The Constitution outlines the government's powers, the limitations on those powers, and the rights of the citizens. Our Founding Fathers recognized that this Great Experiment society would evolve, and that the Constitution would require a mechanism for making changes. Thus, they included an outline for an amendment process to make changes in the future. In addition, they wanted to ensure making changes would require a proposed amendment and that the proposed amendment must be ratified by three-fourths of states.


In 1940, Congress and the President passed a resolution creating "I Am an American Day," observed on the third Sunday in May. In 1952, the holiday was renamed to "Constitution Day" and moved to September 17, the day in 1787 in which the Constitution was signed. In 2004, Congress once again changed the name of the holiday to Constitution Day and Citizenship Day.

Take a moment this day to consider what we stand for as a nation and how we can work together to make the world a better place for all.



THE GRAND LODGE OF AUSTRIA BY: BRO. KALEB LOPEZ JUSTICE-COLUMBIA LODGE NO. 3

Freemasonry has a storied history regardless of where it may be found or discovered, and the country of Austria, is no different in that regard. However, of all the many facets of The Craft, Freemasonry in Austria is peculiarly interesting. Having had the opportunity to visit with the brothers here and see this uniqueness first hand, I can say without hesitation, the story of Freemasonry in Austria is quite literally the embodiment of what it has meant to be brought from the dark to the Light.

To begin, The Craft in Austria was banned and reinstated multiple times throughout its history. In 1743 by order of the Empress, Maria Theresa I, Masonry and any Masonic Lodge, was banned and ordered to be closed. Needless to say, because of that, the practice ceased. Interestingly enough, her husband, Franz Stephan von Lothringen, (later the German Emperor Franz I.) was initiated by a Deputation Lodge in 1731, 12 years previously, for political reasons but was unable to prevent the lodges from being banned and closed. **Empress** Maria Theresa feared the foreign influence of the lodge and therefore would not allow

the brothers to come together practicing Masonry. However, in 1754, through and by accredited diplomats, the "Hanoverian Deputation Lodge "Aux Trois Coers" (The three hearts) with several [members] of the original Lodge "Aux Trois Canons" was established. By 1777 The Craft spurned from the dark to the light and several lodges were born. By 1780, the neighboring lodges in Germany formed several provincial lodges, but it was not till April 24, 1784 that the Grand Lodge of Austria was formed and completely independent from any other country or governing body outside of Austria. Brothers of note and most honorable and worthy brothers among the ranks of those early

brethren included Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, world renowned composer and musician. Unfortunately, with many new and interesting things there are also those who would seek to not fulfill the tenets of the order or adhere to the charges they received as brothers. Due to this increase of those whose work was not worthy of the craft and increasing tensions from religious ideological relationships which were also political, Masonry, once again was ordered to extinguish its light. By 1973, the Emperor Franz Joseph II ordered all lodges go dark. By the mid-1800s to the late 1800s several developments in the region caused for Masonry to, once again, shine. Resulting from the defeat of the Austrian Military in the Battle at Königgrätz in 1866, the Austrian government was weakened to the point there was no choice but to cooperate with their conquerors, the Hungarians. Through the Masonic influence within the Hungarian Empire and the now, Austro-Hungarian Government, "Border Lodges" were formed or also known as "Grenzlogen". From this dual influence more of an open-minded social restructuring took place facilitating The Craft to, once again, gain traction and grow.

Resulting from several liberal societies groups, Freemasonry began to grow in ways that other parts of the world, at that time, were already past but also very different in that the liberalness of Freemasonry was not as traditional, but, more "secular" in its formation and application. At that time much of the "anchor" for Freemasonry came from many of the Jewish members who were the mainstay of the Lodge till 1938. There are many other facts and points to Freemasonry in Austria to add but, for brevity, the main point is that Freemasonry went from the Dark to the Light over a period in history which not only defined The Craft but Humankind as well.

Up to the events leading to WWII, The Craft shined and then, again, was influenced by the forces and powers being antithetical to what the tenet of Brother Love, Relief, and Truth are. In fact, up to this point, the Grand Lodge of London had given full recognition to the Brothers in Austria whereas recognition from German was withdrawn due to the many Jewish members, much of the French influence, and the support of the Scottish Rite within the Lodges of Austria who were very pro-European leaning. On account of the Austrian Government being aligned with and part of the NAZI Government, the Lodge again went dark and wasn't until 1945, after WWII that 48 brothers came together again to reconstitute the Grand Lodge of Austria. With a little help from brethren in the U.S. the Grand Lodge of Austria reignited its light. The following years were, nonetheless difficult to say the least and resulted in the reestablishment of The Craft and two separate Grand Lodges.

The Grand Orient of Austria (1955) and the Grand Lodge of Austria of Ancient, Free and Accepted Freemasons. To Present Day, these two Grand Lodges are in full working order. Of interest with the former, Grand Orient of Austria also known as the Independent Grand Lodge of Austria, which has a very close French Influence there are over 400 members of both brothers and sisters. Suffice it to say, Freemasonry in Austria has its very storied past but a very clear future and years to come will only show how much the Light will always overcome the dark.



Almas Temple Chartered June 14, 1886 134 Years of Service
