MONTHLY MUSINGS

Tales from the Almas Crupt

As told by Frank Ireton, Past Potentate

This month's tale is from the July/August 1961 issue of Almas Life. In going



through the archives of Almas Alibis at the warehouse there are several years that the *Almas Alibi* was published under the *Almas Life* banner. This issue is of interest to the nobility because it is published in celebration of Almas Temple's 75th anniversary.

The lead article focuses on early Almas history and leadership. In 1886 chartered Chieftain, Major W. Bayless, passed the gavel to George H. Walker to become the first named Potentate of Almas Shriners. This is followed by an extensive list of Potetates to 1920 when Henry Lansburgh defeated Potentate L. Whiting Estes who was running for a fifth term. At the 1921 Imperial session Almas Chief Rabban Leonard P. Steuart presented a proposal including a letter of support from the White House for Almas to host the 1923 Imperial session. No action was taken but the proposal was accepted in 1922 for the 1923 Imperial session. Other articles in the issue report on 1961 Almas activities and reports from Units and Clubs.

On June 10th a special Diamond Jubilee Ceremonial was held. In total 108 candidates were initiated including four Kena Temple courtesy candidates. The Ceremonial was held in the Almas ballroom and "over a thousand nobles crowded the ballroom." There was a candidate's parade prior to the Ceremonial from 13th and K Street, around several blocks, returning to the Temple. Candidates were required to march holding a rope. As a side note I remember doing that when I was initiated in Boise's El Korah Shrine in 1977. The Membership convened at 3:00 for the First Section followed by a buffet dinner coordinated by the Sphinx Club. A brief paragraph describes the Second Section—not by name—as "never forgotten stunts and caper of the novices" providing "moments of entertaining fun for the audience."

The 1961 Imperial Session was held June 18-22 in Miami Beach Florida. A



strong showing included Almas Elected and Appointed Divan members, Unit and Club heads and members, and Almas membership. Imperial included a daytime and an evening parade. Almas Military and Oriental Bands marched along with the Greeters, Oriental Patrol, and Legion of Honor. On Wednesday over 400 Nobles and Ladies attended an Almas party at the Bal Harbour Hotel

with music provide by the Almas Band.

This parade is coordinated by Under the Sun Productions and they have strict rules for participation and parading. If Almas wishes to continue to participate in future parades we must abide by their rules.

If you plan on participating you must follow these three steps

- Submit a signed, hard copy of the release of liability form.
 This must arrive at their office no later than <u>March 30</u>.
 Must be submitted by US. Post. Faxed and e-mail not accepted
 <u>All</u> persons participating must submit a form—Shriners and family.
- E-mail or mail a copy to the Colonel of the Units for his records.
 A listing will be submitted to Under the Sun Productions.
 If your name is not on the list you cannot parade.
- On parade day check in with the Almas Parade Marshal when you arrive. Details on times and location will be sent when available.

As this is not a Shrine sponsored parade family members can participate. Limited space is available for riding on the fire engine. Please submit the names of family members who will be riding.

There will be three of the electric scooters available and three of the Tin Lizzy mini cars may be available. These can only be operated by Almas members. There will be a driver's training session held prior to the parade. All drivers must attend the training session.

FAMOUS FEZES

St. Patrick's Day and Freemasonry

Every school kid learns March 17 is the day we celebrate the life and deeds of Maewyn Succat, the second Bishop of Ireland, who is better known as Ireland's Patron Saint, St. Patrick. Those same school kids also learn Patrick's great triumph was chasing the snakes out of Ireland. It's true, there are no snakes in Ireland; however, that's more likely because there have never been any snakes on the isolated island.

Captured and taken into slavery as a youth, Maewyn, a.k.a. Patrick, escaped to the European mainland. While a slave he had converted from paganism to Christianity, and once on the continent, he sought refuge at Marmoutier Abbey, a French monastery. There, he accepted his calling, which was to convert other pagans to Christianity. With that, he returned to Ireland and became very successful at making those conversions. In a manner of speaking, the "serpents" he figuratively chased from Ireland were the pagan Druids, not actual reptiles.

After a successful ministry, Patrick retired to County Down, where he died on March 17, 461 A.D. Although never officially canonized by the Catholic Church he is, in fact, recognized as a saint; and today we celebrate the Feast of St. Patrick, or St. Patrick's Day, on the anniversary of his death.

However, even in Ireland prior to the late 18th century, St. Patrick's Day was not that big of a deal. The same was true in North America, where the churches in Boston, with its large Irish population, didn't recognize the day until 1737.

"So, what," you may ask, "does this have to do with the Freemasons?"

About twenty years later, during the French-Indian War, a young Masonic Colonel recognized the morale among his troops was low and decided they needed what today we would call some "down time." It was March, at the end of a long, brutal winter and many of the troops were Irish. It didn't take the Colonel long to figure out the best day to declare a general holiday would be St. Patrick's day.

Several years later, that same Freemason, now a general in the American Revolution, faced a very similar problem. Billeted at Morristown, New Jersey, his troops were discouraged after a long winter of devastating fighting and losses. On top of that, the preceding winter of 1779-80 was brutally cold. That General, George Washington, again had many Irish troops under his command and once again he saw the opportunity of celebrating St. Patrick's Day to boost morale. With that, Washington issued the order giving his troops their first day off in over two years, "The General directs that all fatigue and working parties cease for to-morrow the SEVENTEENTH instant, a day held in particular regard by the people of [Ireland]."

The respite from the ravages of war and winter went over well with the troops, some of whom were said to celebrate with a "hogshead of rum." Washington is credited with establishing the first instances of a secular celebration of St. Patrick's day, a tradition which caught on and has grown to become a major event today, with the hogshead of rum long replaced by freely flowing green beer.

FEZ FOODIES

CORNED BEEF AND CABBAGE

INGREDIENTS

- 1 (3 pound) corned beef brisket with spice packet
- 10 small red potatoes
- 5 medium carrots
- 1 large head cabbage

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Gather all ingredients
- 2. Place corned beef in a Dutch oven and cover with water. Add spice packet, cover, and When corned beef has cooked for 2 hours, add potatoes and carrots; cook until vegetables are almost tender and meat is fork-tender, about 10 minutes. Add cabbage and cook until tender, about 15 more minutes.bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer until corned beef is just about fork-tender, about 2 hours.
- 3. While the corned beef is simmering, cut potatoes in half. Peel carrots and cut into 3-inch pieces. Cut cabbage into small wedges.
- 4. When corned beef has cooked for 2 hours, add potatoes and carrots; cook until vegetables are almost tender and meat is fork-tender, about 10 minutes. Add cabbage and cook until tender, about 15 more minutes.
- 5. Remove meat and let rest for 15 minutes. Leave broth and vegetables in the Dutch oven. Slice meat across the grain. Serve with vegetables and broth.

- 3oz Jameson Irish Whiskey
- 2oz Peach Schnapps
- 3oz Pineapple Juice
- 2oz Lime Sparkling Soda
- Green food coloring
- Ice Cubes
- · Maraschino Cherries and mint leaves for garnish, optional

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Add Jameson Irish Whiskey, Peach Schnapps, pineapple juice,1 drop of green food color, and ice cubes to a cocktail shaker.
- 2. Shake for 25 seconds
- 3. Strain into a glass filled with fresh ice.
- 4. Top off with lime sparkling soda
- 5. Garnish with cherries and mint

INGREDIENTS

- 2 teaspoons Brown Sugar
- ¾ cup Hot Coffee (strong, or espresso)
- 3 tablespoons Irish Whiskey (1.5 oz)

- add Chocolate Flakes (or ground nutmeg, for garnish)

- 1. Brown Sugar 1 cup granulated sugar plus 1 tablespoon molasses or dark corn syrup
- 2. Heavy Cream 3/4 cup sweet milk plus 1/3 cup butter or 2 cups whipped dessert topping





NEW MEMBERSHIP APP

For dues year 2023, to acknowledge the receipt of the dues (membership) payment, Nobles will receive one communication, a 6x9 personalized postcard. The post card informs Nobles of the following:

- How to download the My FezCard Viewer app to see their newly designed digital membership car.
- How the temple will identify the status of their membership (dues) status, through the My FezCard Viewer and/or scanning of the QR Code on either the digital card or the gold-colored hard membership card.
- The discontinuation of the sticker mailers from Shriners International direct to members.
