

Tales from the Almas Crypt

As told by Frank Ireton, Past Potentate



This month's tale returns to the July/August 1961 issue of *Almas Life*. This issue is of interest to the nobility because it is published in celebration of Almas Temple's 75th anniversary. While the issue devotes a fair amount of time to the Diamond Jubilee and June 10th ceremonial it includes reports and articles from the Clubs and Uniformed Units.

First report is from Almas Alleys. At the summer league's premier meet the league fielded six teams with enough extra bowlers for an additional two teams. Unfortunately, only six lanes were available to the League. The named teams were: Left-Outs,

Woodchucks, Lovers, Y.C.M.J.D.B., Theonettes, and Would-be-Lovers, Extra bowlers became the "Disappointees". If enough bowlers showed interest a second league could be formed.

During the regular season the league that year the league fielded 12 teams. Teams bowled on Monday and Wednesday nights. A tournament was held on the last week with the winner being team George C. Shaffer followed by the Divan, Patrol, Camels, and Sphinx teams. The season ended with trophies presented at the annual banquet held jointly with the Ladies League. For the regular season the Friday night meets are open for a mixed league.

Almas Yacht Club provided an extensive report on activities including participation in the Imperial parade with a 21-foot boat on a trailer. In July seven yachts rendezvoused of the West River for a cruise to Vera's White Sands on the Patuxent River. Along the way south the picked up several other AYC yachts and members of other Bay Yacht Clubs. One boat worthy of mention is "Wee Willie III" a new at the time 40 -foot Flying Bridge cruiser owned by West River Yacht Club's Fleet Captain Winston W. and Mrs. Marsh*. The Potentate and Commodore of the Lord Calvert Yacht Club arrived in his new 35-foot Owens Cruiser.

Other articles from the Uniformed units detail past, current, and future activities. This includes the Greeters, Drum and Bugle, Corps, Patrol, Oriental Band, Chanters, and Legion of Honor. These will be covered as time allows in future *Tales from the Almas Crypt*.

The AYC will once again be represented in the Olney Days Parade on Sunday, May 1st.


By the time you read this Spring MASA will be in the history books. Several AYC members and their ladies attended.

FEZ FOODIES

DARK CHOCOLATE - BOURBON PECAN PIE

INGREDIENTS

- 1 Basic Pie Crust
- 2 large eggs, at room temperature
- 1/2 c. butter, browned and cooled slightly
- 1/4 c. granulated sugar
- 1 c. dark brown sugar
- 1 tbsp. all-purpose flour
- 1 tbsp. whole milk
- 1 tbsp. bourbon
- 1 tsp. pure vanilla extract
- 2 c. pecans, chopped
- 4 oz. dark chocolate, chopped



DIRECTIONS TO MAKE DOUGH IN A STAND MIXER

1. Preheat oven to 375°. On a lightly floured surface, roll out dough into a 12" circle. Drape over pie dish and gently press to fit, making sure there are no air bubbles. Trim edge to 1" and tuck overhang under itself and crimp edges. Bake until lightly golden and only par-baked, 15 minutes.
2. Increase oven temperature to 400°. In a large bowl, beat eggs until slightly foamy, then stir in browned butter, white sugar, and brown sugar. Whisk together until fully combined, then stir in flour, milk, bourbon, and vanilla. Add pecans and chocolate chunks and stir until fully combined. Pour mixture into par-baked pie crust.
3. Bake 10 minutes, then lower oven to 325° and bake until top no longer jiggles in center, 40 to 50 minutes more.
4. Let cool completely before slicing and serving

FEZ FOODIES

SAUTÉED SWEET PLANTAINS (TAJADITAS DULCES DE PLATANO)

INGREDIENTS

- ¼ cup peanut oil for frying
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 3 yellow plantains (very ripe), peeled and cut in 1-inch-thick slices
- 3 tablespoons brown sugar
- ¼ teaspoon salt (Optional)



INSTRUCTIONS

Round up all your ingredients, and heat peanut oil and butter in a large skillet over medium-high heat until butter begins to sizzle.

Gently toss plantain slices with brown sugar, then place into hot oil. Fry until plantains begin to turn golden brown, then turn over, and continue frying until caramelized, about 2 minutes per side.

Drain plantains on a paper towel-lined plate and sprinkle with salt before serving.

FEZ FIZZIES

SPICY WATERMELON MARGARITA

INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups seedless watermelon cubes
- 1 lime wedge
- 1 pinch kosher salt
- ice cubes
- 1 ½ fluid ounces silver tequila
- ¾ fluid ounce orange-flavored liqueur (such as Cointreau®)
- ¾ fluid ounce lime juice
- 1 thin slice jalapeño slice, plus more for garnish
- 1 watermelon wedge



INSTRUCTIONS

1. Puree watermelon in a blender. Wipe the rim of a margarita glass with a lime wedge; dip rim in salt.
2. In a cocktail shaker half-filled with ice, add tequila, orange liqueur, lime juice, jalapeño, and 2 ounces of the watermelon puree. Shake until very cold.
3. Strain into prepared glass. Garnish with watermelon wedge and jalapeño slice.

TIPS:

Instead of salt, you can also use coarse white decorating sugar for rimming.

Reserve remaining puree for up to 4 more cocktails.

NEW MEMBERSHIP APP

For dues year 2023, to acknowledge the receipt of the dues (membership) payment, Nobles will receive one communication, a 6x9 personalized postcard. The post card informs Nobles of the following:

- How to download the My FezCard Viewer app to see their newly designed digital membership card.
- How the temple will identify the status of their membership (dues) status, through the My FezCard Viewer and/or scanning of the QR Code on either the digital card or the gold-colored hard membership card.
- The discontinuation of the sticker mailers from Shriners International direct to members.

How to Download and Use My FezCard Viewer

1. Open the App Store on your phone.
2. Search for "My FezCard Viewer" and click on the icon.
3. Click the "Install" button to install My FezCard Viewer.


