



As we approach the end of the year here is a recap of Almas parades for 2023 and parade guidelines as laid out by Shriners International. Parades are an important part of the Shrine culture and General Order Number One, issued by Imperial, lays out detailed regulations for Shrine Centers participating in parades. Although not required by Imperial or Almas, anyone one participating in or operating vehicles are encouraged to obtain an umbrella liability insurance policy. These policies are relatively inexpensive and available through your home owners insurance. In the event of an accident, you can personally be held libel for damages or injuries. Almas insurance does not cover you for this.

Two types of parades, Shrine and Non-Shrine or civic parades are identified

and regulated by Imperial. The regulations are similar but with a few important differences. Non-Shriners such as family members can participate in civic parades and must follow the guidelines set down for Shrine members. Only Shriners can participate in a Shrine parade. In either case, only Shriners can operate modified vehicles or vehicles with less than four wheels. Shriners in parades must be identified as Shriners and wear a Fez. Emergency lights or sirens may not be engaged, candy or other objects cannot be thrown from a vehicle,



vehicles must be operated in a safe manner, and conform to local regulations.

Unfortunately, Mother Nature was not welcoming this year for our first two parades. First, weather forecasts leading up to the Chinese New Year parade were not favorable, calling for rain or snow. After much discussion, it was decided to not risk taking the vehicles out. The second parade, the Olney Days parade, was canceled by the organizers due to possibility of heavy rain or Thunderstorms. The National Cherry Blossom parade and the Independence Day Parade in DC were our two summer parades. The parades are televised and are coordinated by Under the Sun Productions. These are invitational parades and, while Imperial guidelines apply as Civic parades, Under the Sun has guidelines as well. They require a signed release of liability form from all participants be submitted in hard copy via USPS. Forms are collected by the Colonel of the Units and mailed to meet the deadline as e-mail or late submissions are not accepted.

The final parade this year was the MASA Parade in Virginia Beach. Virginia Beach is a Shrine parade so Shrine parade rules apply. This year Almas participation consisted of the Almas Yacht Club float, four mini-cars, and a lone scooter—thank you Illustrious Sir Don Holliday for being brave enough to ride the scooter—and Almas Mini-motors. The Almas color guard was organized by High Priest and Prophet Dominador Carreon with help from Illustrious Sir Tony Murray. Divan members Assistant Rabban Geoffrey Newman and Oriental Guide

Chuck Carmichael carried the Almas banner. Illustrious Sir Carpenter Arpa piloted the Potentate's mini-cruisier, perhaps a little slower than the aircraft he is used to piloting.

Parades are fun to participate in and one way we can get the message out about our hospital system. Parades do not happen in a vacuum. There is a lot of preparation and coordination that goes on behind the scenes preparing. Check with the parade team if you are interested in helping in these important behind the scene preparations. A big shout-out to pre-parade workers Nobles Bill Hinton III, Bill Hinton, Chuck Russel, Chuck Carmichael and Illustrious Sir Alan Gordon for the work at the warehouse in preparing the trailers, scooters, and cars for the parade. Also, to the Nobles on parade day who helped decorate the Yacht Club Float and Pickup. It was great to see participation in the MASA parade by the Mini-motors and the driving demonstrations they put on during the parade. I understand that once again this year the Mini-motors took trophies during the competitions on Friday. Congratulations to the Mini-motor Unit.

This year at MASA a new mini-car joined the growing fleeting of mini-Tin Lizzies and parade cars. The cars and the four scooters already in the fleet will



available for members to operate at parades. These vehicles can only be driven by Shriners in parades per Imperial guidelines. The vehicles will eventually become part of a proposed new Almas club, The Misfits, so named due to the variety of vehicles. Our goal will be to train members in safe vehicle operation, and maintenance, Club members will be responsible in preparing vehicles for parades. If you are interested in joining the

Misfits club and driving in a parade, watch for details in forthcoming Alibis.

In closing I want to add a personal thank you to all Almas Shiners and family member who participated and made the Almas parades successful this year. Join us next year for fun and support our efforts to bring awareness to the Shriners Hospitals for Children.

FAMOUS FEZ

Tales from the Almas Crypt

As told by Frank Ireton, Past Potentate

This month's Alibi cover, from the dusty Almas archives, is the October/ September 1943 issue of the Alibi. In October of 1943 the United States was involved in a world war on two fronts, Eastern and Western. While the invasion of Continental Europe was still eight months in the future, our forces were doing battle in the South Pacific on remote islands with names unknown to most US citizens. Names like Iwo Jima, Bougainville, Guadalcanal, and Efate. The 1943 issue is interesting to read to get a glimpse of Almas and the Shrine during the war years.

The Potentate's message primarily deals with the business of the temple, the preceding year's Imperial Session held in Washington, DC, the search for a 200-candidate ceremonial, and securing funding to refinance the building. He closes by saying: "it appears our armies are pushing to ultimate victory" and welcomes Nobles home on furlough. The Imperial Potentate's message focuses on efforts by Temples to keep activities going with wartime restrictions. He quotes a Noble who wrote: "Keep the sands warm until we get home again." It doesn't say where the Noble was stationed but he remarks about seeing: "many a fez on dour faces of the natives." He closes by urging the buying of an extra (war) bond: "to make it hot for the Shickelgruber and Hirohito." A brief article mentions two Nobles, one KIA and one presumed to have been taken as a POW in the Philippines and being held as a captive in China. Two of the three columns on another page lists 175 Almas Nobles serving—in addition to earlier lists.

All in all, most of the issue deals with the normal activities of Almas with unit and club reports on activities and upcoming events. The specter of war is present throughout the issue. A short article mentions the Scottish Rite Biennial Session being limited due to travel restrictions and rationing. Another article relates the story of a US Marine aboard a ship in the South Pacific struck by a 20 mm antiaircraft shell below his left breast that lodged near his left hip. The shell was removed by two surgeons working behind a steel plate. An article reports on the launch of a sub-chaser from a shipyard located on the Willamette River in Oregon. The christening was organized by the shipyard manager, Noble Al Bauer. A theme of Freedom for All was chosen in part for the war effort and in part to honor Shrine Hospitals efforts to give all children freedom from childhood afflictions. An issue mentioned several times was securing funding to refinance the building's \$90,000 mortgage at a lower rate to save \$2,000 a year in interest. The property was assessed at \$170,400 and valued at \$200,000

I chose this issue's cover for personal reasons as October 1943 is my birth year—yes, I am that old. In October of 1943 my fatheron the right in the photo with his cousin—arrived at Henderson



Field on Guadalcanal as part of the US Marines Airwing's VMSB-235. In civilian parlance that is Fixed Wing (V), Marine (M), Scout Bomber (SB) squadron number 235. VMSB- 235 flew the



Dauntless SBD-5, a multi-purpose artillery observation spotter, bomber, and strafing aircraft. On October 10th they were relocated to Efate, New Hebrides and eight days later, on the other side of the world, my mother gave birth to a bouncing baby boy. One year later to the date the troop ship carrying my father sailed under the Golden Gate.







FEZ FOODIES

LIT'L SMOKIES MUMMY DOGS

INGREDIENTS

- 32 Hillshire Farm Lit'l Smokies®
- 1 (8 ounce) can refrigerated crescent dough rolls
- Mustard or ketchup, if desired



DIRECTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees F.
- 2. Unroll dough, separate at perforations, creating 4 rectangles. Press perforations to seal.
- 3. With a knife or pizza cutter cut each rectangle lengthwise into 8 strips making a total of 32 strips. Wrap one strip of dough around each Lit'l Smokies stretching dough slightly to look like bandages, leaving tip exposed to create face. Place on ungreased cookie sheet.
- 4. Bake 12 to 14 minutes or until golden brown. Draw features on tip of Lit'l Smokies to create face. Serve with mustard or ketchup, if desired.

PUMPKIN SPICE MARTINI

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup ice cubes
- 1 (1.5 fluid ounce) jigger vanilla flavored vodka (such as Stoli)
- 1 (1.5 fluid ounce) jigger Irish cream liqueur (such as Bailey's)
- 1 (1.5 fluid ounce) jigger pumpkin flavored liqueur (such as Hiram Walker)
- 1 pinch ground cinnamon
- 1 pinch ground nutmeg



INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Fill a cocktail shaker with ice.
- 2. Pour vanilla-flavored vodka, Irish cream liqueur, and pumpkin-flavored liqueur over ice. Cover and shake until the outside of the shaker has frosted.
- 3. Strain into a chilled martini glass. Garnish with ground cinnamon and ground nutmeg.





The cost of a plaque is \$100. For details on ordering a plaque, please contact III. Fred Evans. PP.




