For Noemi, More Range of Motion Means More Possibilities



Story Summary

If you ask 9-year-old Noemi which superpowers she would want most, she answers "teleportation" and "healing." It's not hard to imagine why.

Immediately after Noemi was born, the neonatal intensive care unit referred her and her mother Andrea to Shriners Children's™. They visited for the first time when Noemi was two weeks old, and she was diagnosed with arthrogryposis multiplex congenita.

PATIENT NEWS

This rare disorder causes stiff joints and abnormal muscle development. It can lead to a limited range of motion in wrists, hands, elbows, shoulders, hips, knees and ankles. Sometimes, the motion is so limited that the joint is fixed and there's no movement at all.

Arthrogryposis has no known cure, but because the physicians at Shriners Children's have treated thousands of children with this disorder, Andrea knew that her baby was in good hands.

Over the years Noemi has benefited from a range of treatments including casting, orthotics, and corrective surgeries. These interventions have changed the course of her life. Without them, Noemi wouldn't be able to walk, but with them, her mobility and independence are flourishing.

Thanks to treatment, Noemi can complete many activities of daily life. P.E. is one of her favorite classes, and a special program at Shriners Children's has helped her realize another dream. Through BikeFit, Noemi was gifted and trained on an adaptive bike. Now she can experience the joy of peddling and cruising alongside her siblings and friends.

Life. As I mentioned in a previous Tales, the Alibi was published under this head for several years. It was published bi-monthly for a yearly subscription fee of \$2.00 or 35 cents per copy. In today's dollars that equates to about \$21.00 per year or \$4.50 per issue. Several full-page ads appear throughout the publication and column formatted pages feature small ads. These small ads offer services such as electrical, glass, real estate, home remodeling, auto services, financial services, several funeral homes, and included one for burial vaults. One



ad promotes the Almas Bowling Alley for bowling and private parties.

Newly installed Potentate Illustrious Sir J. Benton Webb thanked the nobility



for electing him and laid out his plans for the year. Illustrious Sir Webb was born June 11th, 1895 in Nashville, Tennessee. After an apprenticeship with a local engraving company, he and his wife moved to the Washington Area in 1920 where he and his brother opened an engraving business. His Masonic affiliations included Columbia Lodge No. 3, Albert Pike Consistory, and the Royal Order of Jesters. His hobby was music and he studied voice. He

held positions as a soloist and director in Nashville and Washington choirs.

The 1959 Fall Ceremonial was held at the Statler-Hilton Masons hotel. Sixty-eight crossed the hot sands to join Almas and share in the fun of Shrinedom. That evening a special program and dance was held for new Nobles and



their Ladies. The Hotel's Presidential and Congressional Ballrooms were filled with the new Nobles, their Ladies, and Almas members and Ladies.

The following guidelines apply to the use of social media by all Nobles in their capacity as a Shriner, or in which one identifies himself as a Shriner through images or words on personal or public social media platforms and websites, as well as on behalf of all Shrine Associations, Temples, Units and Shrine Clubs. Nobles should always be aware that all electronic communications are permanent and may be made public, even if deleted.

Nothing in this section imposes any limitation on purely independent speech or expression which is unrelated to the Shrine. Each member must determine for himself whether his personal communications or conduct, online or in person, meet the extremely high standards expected of a Shriner.

All internet and cellular phone based electronic communications must:

- Be in compliance with and conform to the Code of Ethics of Shriners International (Bylaws §210.7).
- Reflect positively on Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children.
- Not contain content or commentary that is antagonistic, bullying, confidential, defamatory, harassing, offensive, political, pornographic, profane, racially motivated or religious.
- Not contain a third party's copyrighted material, trademarks, service marks or other protected material.
- Not post private temple and fraternal matters on public facing social media. These matters include, but are not limited to:
 - Legal, disciplinary, and personnel issues;
 - b. A pending petition for membership of a particular candidate;
 - c. Financial matters related to the fraternity or charity; and
 - d. Fraternal or charitable legislative proposals, such as "the Call" for Imperial Sessions.
- Be factually accurate and based on credible information. Acknowledge and correct mistakes promptly.
- Adhere to the branding and stylistic guidelines contained in the Shriners International Fraternal Style Guide and the Shriners Hospitals for Children Identity Standards and Guidelines. These guidelines can currently be found on the Shriners International website in the members section.

In addition, all official Association, Temple. Unit and Shrine Club social media profiles, websites, and accounts must be accessible to and controlled by more than one administrator. Violation of these guidelines may be considered in determining whether such posts constitute conduct unbecoming a Noble.

Ceremonial Cast

The Ceremonial Cast is responsible for presenting the initiation for new nobles. There is more than one degree in the initiation which includes not only the ceremony in which you participated, but also an Arch Degree which encompasses a presentation of all the Masonic Bodies collectively. The Arch Degree requires more than 50 nobles to present and is intended to be more for the families of new nobles than for the nobles themselves. To my knowledge, Almas Shrine has never presented the Arch Degree, but it is something to which we aspire.

The primary ceremonial is the ritualistic initation and can be presented either open or closed at the discretion of the Potentate.

Being a part of the Ceremonial Cast includes some memorization, but it is also intended to be the 'fun' ritual where we can dress in costumes and have a good time while presenting good ritual. It would be nice to be a ritualist but that is not required as there are non-speaking parts as well as behind the scenes activities that go into the Ceremonial.

Generally, we have three rehearsals to prepare for each Ceremonial, but can also participate in parades in costume as well. The Ceremonials are held two times a year.

Almas Yacht Club

The Almas Yacht Club was formed to provide an organization for those Shriners interested in sailing on the waters surrounding the Chesapeake Bay.

The conception of the Almas Yacht Club was the result of a group of Almas Shriners interested in forming such a club in 1955. The yacht club, consisting of 23 members, became an entity in 1956 when it received its charter. The first Bridge consisted of the following: Commodore – Alton S. Bradford, Vice Commodore – Edward C. Baltz, Rear Commodore – Robert Doing, Fleet Captain – Garrett Beitzell, Secretary – Jack J. Blank, Treasurer – Roy Lyman Sexton.

Membership in the Yacht Club has fluctuated over the years. From its meager beginning of 23 members, it grew to 86 by 1967 and had a fleet of 54 boats ranging in size from 12 feet to 67 feet in length. Records are a bit sketchy from the early years, but by 1982, membership had decreased to 70 members with 27 boats. In 1991 there were 57 members and 22 boats; 1999 had 37 members and 13 boats; in 2012 there were 43 members and 7 boats.

The decreasing boat numbers dictated that we had to change the focus of the club from one of boating activities to include land functions as well where we would meet at a variety of restaurants or similar locations to conduct meetings and take care of the business of the club. We still maintained our membership in the Mid-Atlantic Association of Shrine Yacht Clubs (MAASYC) where we would meet at a selected location for the annual summer rendezvous. Many members of the other yacht clubs in MAASYC would bring their boats and engage in a friendly competition of a boat parade, boat decoration and other fun activities. We also participated in the activities of the annual Mid-Atlantic Shrine Association (MASA) where the several Shrine Temples engaged in a variety of club competitions which would culminate in the annual parade.

The ultimate goal of the numerous activities of the temple yacht clubs was to win the *Evers Trophy*, a large trophy awarded to the yacht club which amassed the most points over a twelve-month period beginning with the MASA convention parade were the Shrine Centers compete with their floats and marching units. The name "Almas" appears on this trophy several times.

From the outset, it should be noted that our Ladies have always been an intricate part of the Yacht Club. Over the years they have provided delicious meals and refreshments at many of our functions and assisted in many of our activities. We will always be grateful for their willingness to be an active part of the club.

Although it has been necessary to change some of our boating activities, we have never compromised our enthusiasm, zeal or any of our Shrine principles to enjoy good fellowship, welcome new Nobles and their Ladies into our club, provide support to the members when needed, and support the Shriners Hospitals for Children.

The Yacht Club extends an invitation to all Shriners to investigate and join in our activities and consider becoming a member. Ownership of a boat is not necessary.

FEZ FIZZIES

CHRISTMAS MARGARITA

Ingredients

- 1 Tbsp.
- sparkling sugar
- 1 tsp. kosher salt
- 1 lime wedge
- For the drink:
- · 4 oz. cream of coconut, whisked
- 4 oz. silver tequila
- 2 oz. orange liqueur (such as Cointreau)
- 11/2 oz. fresh lime juice, plus 2 lime wheels, for garnish
- 2 maraschino cherries, for garnish



Instructions

- For the rim: Place the sparkling sugar and salt on a small plate and carefully toss to combine. Run a lime wedge around the rims of 2 glasses, then dip the rims in the sugar mixture.
- 2For the drink: Fill a cocktail shaker with ice. Add the cream of coconut, tequila, orange liqueur, and lime juice. Shake for 10 to 20 seconds to chill thoroughly.
- 3Strain the cocktail into the 2 glasses, being careful not to splash the rims. Garnish each with a lime wheel and a maraschino cherry.

FEZ FOODIES

STEAK DIANE

Ingredients

- 2 (8-oz.) strip steaks
- · Kosher salt, to taste
- Black pepper, to taste
- 2 Tbsp. salted butter
- 2 Tbsp. olive oil
- 1 small red onion, finely diced
- 3 garlic cloves, sliced
- 1 tsp. fresh thyme leaves
- 1/2 c. brandy
- 1 c. heavy cream
- 1 Tbsp. whole-grain mustard
- 1 Tbsp. balsamic reduction
- 3 Tbsp. minced chives, for sprinkling



DIRECTIONS

- 1. Heat a large heavy-bottomed skillet over medium-high heat.
- 2. Season all sides of the steaks generously with salt and pepper.
- 3. Heat the butter and oil in the skillet. Add the steaks, and cook to the desired temperature, about 3 minutes per side for medium-rare (130°F internal temperature). Remove the steaks to a cutting board to rest.
- 4. Add the onion, garlic, and thyme to the steak drippings in the skillet, and cook over medium-high heat, stirring, to soften, 2 to 3 minutes. Remove the skillet from the heat. Add the brandy and stir to combine. Return to the heat and deglaze the pan, scraping the bottom with a wooden spoon to release all the flavorful bits. Stir in the heavy cream, mustard, and balsamic reduction, and bring to a simmer. Season with a pinch of salt and pepper, and let cook to thicken, about 2 minutes. Remove from the heat.
- 5. To serve, slice the steaks and shingle the pieces on a platter or plates. Spoon the sauce on top and sprinkle with the chives.
